Tour de France Panto:

Twenty-four year 7 and 8 students travelled to Anglia Ruskin University on Friday, to take part in *Pinot La Pantomime*, a sing-along musical extravaganza!

The story follows Pinot, a Russian illegal immigrant, who comes to France with a big dream: to win the Tour de France! We watch as he sneaks into Paris on the Eurostar, learns to speak French, befriends *Les Jaunes* and *Les Verts* (two of the most dangerous gangs in Paris!), all whilst avoiding being caught by the *Gendarmes*

(police). The students were lucky enough to watch a group of professional actors perform the pantomime themselves, with many of the dance sequences performed by real Russian Cossack dancers. The students then had the opportunity to work with the actors (and to discover that Cossack dancing is **not** as easy as it looks!) to hone their own performance.

In the evening, the pantomime, organised by Routes into Languages East was then performed to the public at the Mumford Theatre as part of the Cambridge *Vélo* Festival. Ernulf students opened the performance, with later scenes staged by students from other Cambridgeshire schools, helping to raise nearly £50 towards Marie Curie Cancer Care, the *Tour's* first official charity.

The Students had an absolutely wonderful time! Their behaviour was exemplary throughout the day, and their scene was the most inclusive and polished of all of the schools who took part, despite being by far the largest group. Congratulations to all those who took part.



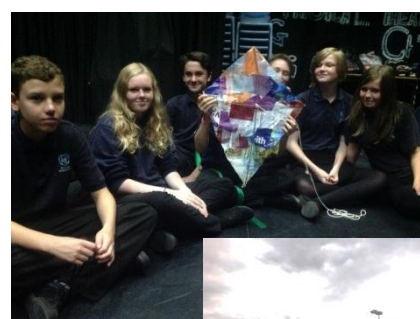
